



St. Michael's Catholic Parish Strategic Plan

The Strategic Plan for 2014 to 2019 builds on the Parish's strong foundation and addresses all six Diocesan Goals with particular emphasis on Goal II, the New Evangelization. Its main objective, meeting the needs within and beyond the Parish, will focus on nurturing and sustaining conversion and spiritual renewal, proclaiming the gospel and evangelizing through liturgical celebrations, reaching out to those in need and supporting on-going faith formation.

The following are some of the achievements for 2015/2016 and future plans for 2016/2017 for each of the six Goals. A more comprehensive description of each Goal, Achievements and Future Plans is available on the St. Michael's website: www.stmichaels.dioceseoflondon.ca

Goals I and V Strategic Priority: *Nurture and sustain ongoing conversion and spiritual renewal that responds to Diversity and One's relationship with Christ*

- ✦ Father Don's very popular Bible Study was completed June 2016 with a future Bible study or scriptural study considered for Fall 2016.
- ✦ Oremus Prayer has been well received, and there are intentions to repeat the program in Fall 2016. Other forms of prayer are also being investigated.
- ✦ The Parish continues to encourage an environment of including and welcoming everyone from diverse ethnic communities.
- ✦ Youth Ministry continues "YouNight" and Teen Nights as a means of attracting youth activity within the Parish.

Goal II Strategic Priority: *Evangelize through living out our faith in our parish and beyond through clear proclamation of the Gospel*

- ✦ The Community Meal (Northern Hospitality) is becoming more ecumenical as a group of Jewish university students are volunteering on a regular basis, and Maitland Baptist Church is serving meals at least twice a year.
- ✦ Father Don's Baptism Program "Basics of Baptism" and the relationship that occurs is well received.
- ✦ Goal III Strategic Priority: Evangelize through reaching out to the wounded, the searching, the entrapped and those in material and spiritual need
- ✦ Northern Hospitality Community Meal will continue to be served weekly through 2016/2017.
- ✦ The Pastoral Team meets with school principals annually.
- ✦ Visiting the homebound and lonely at five nursing homes and First Friday visits to the elderly continue to be a priority.
- ✦ "Yarning with Love" is a very successful Saturday morning program growing in popularity.

Goal IV Strategic Priority: *Evangelize through meaningful liturgical celebration*

- ✦ An increased numbers of gift bearers, altar servers and Eucharistic Ministers.
- ✦ A new program (Faith in Action Teams) FIAT will start with two elementary schools in September 2016. This program is designed to connect schools/students with the Parish in a more visible way.
- ✦ Confessions in Nursing Homes have been implemented and well received.

Goal VI Strategic Priority: *Employ and model governance practices*

- ✦ Regular invitations to various volunteer opportunities in bulletin and individual requests to parishioners to share talents.
- ✦ Currently redesigning website with intent of being 'first thought' for finding information about Parish and its various ministries.
- ✦ Ensuring effective communication with parents of children celebrating sacraments at St. Michael's Parish continues to be a high priority of the Parish team.
- ✦ Continuing implementation of upgraded Health and Safety strategy. Safe handling of food training completed July 2015. AED installed, training completed Fall 2015. Fire and Safety evacuation plan in progress.

The Pastoral Team and the Parish Pastoral Council continue to use the strategic plan as a guide when considering new activities that support the vibrant, welcoming St. Michael's community.
